These anniversaries come at a time when Valletta, our Capital city and a legacy inherited from the Order of St. John, is undergoing major infrastructural regeneration and restoration works, especially in the entry way to our city a few meters away from here.

Valletta is the hallmark of Maltese vibrancy and creativity. While it represents the past and the present, its impeccable stature makes it a gateway to the future.

Connecting with Valletta is like connecting with the world, as it comes forward as a melting pot of the

cultural and political movements that constructed Europe as we know it today.

The same could be said of the inner harbour area, which possesses many of the historic treasures from the time of the Order of St John in Malta.

I am pleased to say that restoration works are underway on St Angelo - a titan project which requires the joint collaboration of the Order to complete.

I am sure that the Order recognises the importance attached to this ambitious project and will assist in bringing it back to its former glory.

A word of thanks goes to the Malta Association of the Sovereign Military Order for the philanthropic work carried out throughout the years.

In particular, I would like to mention the funds donated to Boffa Hospital in 2005 to train medical staff in palliative care. Your untiring commitment towards improving the lives of less fortunate people is evidence of the importance the Order attaches to helping people in need.

My Presidency remains committed to champion these milestones, and other initiatives, with a view to ensure that no person is left behind.

To this effect, my open invitation to the Order is to propose ideas for the restoration of the three Presidential Palaces, so that they may retain their former glory while rendering Palaces self-sufficient.

My Presidency is keen to engage further with the Order to explore ways to enhance cooperation in social areas such as poverty, family well-being, children and young people's needs as well as addictions.

I am sure that with the Order's support, many of the Presidency's initiatives in this regard will render the desired results.

It is evident that Malta and the Sovereign Military Order of Malta have reason to continue with their collaboration on several socio-cultural issues of mutual interest.

Although institutional bilateral relations between the two sides started in 1966, we all know that in real fact; our excellent and friendly relations are much older.

We firmly believe that today more than ever, our shared commitment towards peace and solidarity remain crucial for the preservation of all that we managed to painstakingly achieve in the past.

Our common resolve towards inclusiveness through dialogue and people-to-people contact should remain a beacon of light that continue to show the way for others to follow in the path of making our world a better place to live.
