European Social Network, Recorded Message, 22nd June 2017

The SDGs address the root causes of the complex social, economic, political, and environmental concerns which humanity is facing, by transforming such challenges into opportunities for growth.

I believe, and I am sure that you all share my conviction, that Agenda 2030 provides the most effective framework to guide the future of our European Union, and to secure the holistic social wellbeing of all our nations.

I hope that this conference will create a space for you to explore the SDGs, and their targets, more deeply, and to give them an appropriate European identity.

In this way, the SDGs shall offer an ideal platform, from which to tackle the issues of greatest concern within our nations, including poverty and exclusion; support for vulnerable individuals; the phenomenon of migration; child and youth empowerment; and building bottom-up strategies and partnerships, which provide equitable, community-based prosperity.

Let me quote a communication from the European Commission, released last year, which states;

"European societies today face many sustainability challenges, from youth unemployment to ageing populations, climate change, pollution, sustainable energy and migration... To preserve the European social model and social cohesion, it is essential to invest in our young people, to foster inclusive and sustainable growth, to tackle inequalities and to manage migration... To preserve our natural capital, it is crucial to accelerate the transition to a low-carbon, climate resilient, resource efficient and circular economy. For these challenges to become opportunities for new businesses and new jobs, a strong engagement in research and innovation is needed." End quote.

By working together, you can maintain a European-level momentum, to achieve sustainable development within our nations, and to secure greater investment in processes of positive change, for the social and economic benefit of all our peoples.

On the other hand, I am certain that each and every citizen has a role to play, to create a Union which is stronger, safer, and more capable of meeting the needs of our families and communities.

We must work in synergy, to pursue a common vision, rooted in the principles of solidarity. Our sense of untied purpose will give us the strength we need, to turn our aspirations into reality, for the benefit of all the individuals, families, and communities within our European Union, and across our world.
