We must make the choice for hope.

We must make the choice for dignity and respect.

We must make the choice to nurture the best within ourselves, and to openly and freely share it with all of humanity. I am confident that the synergies this coalition is creating, and the partnerships it has already fostered, will continue to promote our shared aspirations for a global culture of peace and wellbeing.
