Speech by H.E. Marie-Louise Coleiro Preca, President of Malta at the Bulgaria-Malta Business Forum

For this reason, my State Visit is aimed at tangibly developing our already excellent diplomatic and political relations into practical and sustainable results for our businesses, but also to develop stronger relations between our peoples.

Furthermore, the presence in Bulgaria of a strong and diverse trade delegation from Malta and Gozo shows just how determined Maltese authorities and businesses are, to pursue closer collaborations among our authorities and business communities, to ensure that we grow and prosper together.

The Maltese Islands have much to offer in this area, including state-of-the-art institutions for training, logistics services, financial services, ICT, hospitality and tourism, and the teaching of English as a foreign language, amongst others.
