and the Mediterranean Academy of Diplomatic Studies at the University of Malta, and the University of National and World Economy of Sofia.

Such Memoranda of Understanding and agreements will certainly open further mutual opportunities, in a variety of sectors.

For our mutual businesses to flourish, and in particular to develop further the tourism industry, it is imperative that we ensure direct connectivity between our two countries. Hence, I look forward to the outcomes of the constructive discussions which are being held between Air Malta and Bulgaria Air.

Amongst the various sectors discussed, between President Radev and myself, and our delegations, these included the areas of financial services; digital games; education and training in various sectors, such as healthcare; transhipment and logistics; tourism and hospitality; and the teaching of English as a foreign language, amongst others.
