Speech delivered by H.E. Marie-Louise Coleiro Preca, President of Malta during the Malta-Portugal Business Forum, during the State Visit to the Republic of Portugal, 15 May 2018

Therefore, I would like to urge the Portuguese and Maltese Chambers of Commerce and Industry to continue exploring all our mutual potential.

I would like to remind you that governments are only enablers; it is your role, as entrepreneurs, to take our collaborations to the next level.

In conclusion, I believe that there is no limit to what we can do and achieve together.

The presence of our respective business communities here, today, is evidence of the strong commitment and enthusiasm, felt by our business sectors, to collaborate and to develop new partnerships.
