Sometimes, standing up for these values brings us into conflict with others, or even worse, it sometimes feels like it brings us head-to-head with the rest of the world. Therefore, I augur that you will be courageous, and face such challenges with passion and determination. Your success will give you the resilience to ensure that you can contribute to make a real difference, not only in your lives but also in the lives of others.

On concluding, let me urge you to make this occasion a momentous turning point in your lives, to commit yourselves towards the values of solidarity, social responsibility, and an ethical perspective.

I believe that is the commitment which all of us must make in order to transform our world into a better place, for the benefit of our generation and future generations.

Finally, let me once again congratulate you on your achievement, and convey to each and every one of you my very best wishes for the future.
