Opening Address by H.E. Marie-Louise Coleiro Preca, President of Malta at an Interfaith Consultation Discussion entitled "United in Dialogue" at "The Majlis: Cultures in Dialogue" at The Palace, Valletta, 23 October 2018

This is because religious groups have, throughout the centuries, been doing their utmost to help to lift the poor out of precarity; to feed the hungry; to build hospitals and care for the sick; to maintain educational institutions; and to welcome strangers, in desperate need of support.

People of faith have so much to offer, in terms of recognising and protecting the dignity of every person; honouring the diverse families, which make up our communities; and prioritising our moral responsibility to care for our environment, while also spreading a message of peace and respect.

Of course, the potential to share these virtues with one another does not end with people of faith. Each and every individual in society, whether a believer or not, has the duty to defend the dignity of others.

Let me also take this opportunity to draw your attention to some important research, which shows that, in the next thirty years, an increasing number of people will form part of the world's diverse religions.

Therefore, it is essential for us to set a good example, by creating mutually beneficial and respectful relationships among all faith traditions.

I believe that Malta has a special role to play, as a bridge between cultures and continents, and a strong voice for peace and dialogue.

This interfaith event is an opportunity for you, as community leaders, to make a tangible and long-lasting contribution

I am sure you will all agree with me, that religion has a unique role, to be a driver for love, peace, and respect in Maltese society.

The people of Malta are living proof of the rich diversity of influences and traditions, which make up the peoples of the Mediterranean.

Let us always strive to be an example of strength and solidarity, by engaging in meaningful dialogue and forming deep friendships between and amongst our communities.

We are a family, and like every family, we must want the best for one another, in order for all of us to achieve the desired success.

I believe that each and every one of us has something vital to contribute, as a crucial contributor to build sustainable peace and inclusive prosperity.

Let us be united, in pursuit of peace, prosperity, and wellbeing, thereby safeguarding equality, equity, and dignity for each and every member of society in the Maltese Islands, and for the whole of humanity.
