Speech delivered by H.E. Marie-Louise Coleiro Preca, President of Malta, at the Malta-Turkey Business Forum, 23 January 2019

Furthermore, Foreign Direct Investment in Malta increased by almost 1 billion euros, in the second quarter of 2018.

To realise the extent of this success, one must analyse the data in the Maltese context.

Malta's success is also realized through the growth of Maltese businesses, which have become extensive, so much so that Maltese businesses are seeking new ventures and opportunities, for expansion beyond the Maltese shores.

We also need to translate our excellent diplomatic and political relations through tangible business collaborations.

It is by taking our socio-economic ties to a higher-level, that we will ensure peopleto-people contact, and to also develop sustainable friendships.

We do not want to be simply acquaintances, but we must continue to work to become partners for the benefit of our peoples and our region.

The presence of a strong ministerial delegation together with a diverse trade delegation from Malta, and the presence of entrepreneurs and people in business from Turkey, for this economic forum, is a clear indication of the confidence and trust, that we mutually enjoy, in each other.

This gives us great satisfaction.

This is also reflected in the fact that commercial interests between Malta and Turkey have grown, over the years, and this is resulting in a decrease of the trade deficit. Another indicator of our business enthusiasm, but also of the urge for connection, is the increase in visitors from Turkey to Malta. On the other hand, Malta's economic success, is also resulting into an increase of Maltese tourists visiting Turkey.

However, there is much more we can do in this respect. An important tourism sector, in my country is educational tourism. Definitely, this is an area where we can seek further collaboration for Turkish students to come to Malta to study the English Language, at our many excellent educational institutions.

Therefore, let me encourage you, and also extend my government's invitation, for the business communities of both our countries to take advantage of the many opportunities that exist between us.

Malta offers the right environment for business, which includes a sound financial sector, a highly-competent and professional workforce in all sectors, excellent connectivity, and a favourable tax regime.

The only limit to what we can achieve, is how high our aspirations go, and how big our ambitions can be, to create an environment of inclusive prosperity for the benefit of the peoples of Malta and Turkey.

Malta is continuing to be proactive, and again is now, in the process of creating the necessary regulatory framework for Artificial Intelligence. In this context of continuing to strengthen our already excellent relations, by finding tangible ways of connecting, let me reaffirm my government's support for the ongoing dialogue between Turkey and the European Union. It is Malta's vision and mission to continue to support the enlargement process of the European Union.

This is Malta's belief, for a sustainable, peaceful and an inclusive and prosperous Europe and region.

Finally, let me urge you to take this opportunity to find innovative ways to enhance business collaboration between our two countries, so that, together, we can ensure that our nations, will continue to grow and prosper together, not only in the best interests of our economies, but above all, in the best interest of our peoples.
