All of us know that the empowerment of women, as managers, employees, producers, and consumers is a catalyst, to expand the growth of our businesses and our society as a whole.

Women are key drivers of economic growth, but to fulfil this role, they must be enabled to effectively enjoy their rights.

For this reason, I urge all stakeholders from the private sector to collaborate with our authorities and civil society activists, to improve the opportunities that are available to women, as part of a holistic strategy that is rooted in the principles of equality, equity, and social justice.

This is what these awards are all about.

Furthermore, gender equality and women's empowerment are a cornerstone of the United Nations' Agenda 2030 for Sustainable Development, which was adopted by all of our countries in 2015. Agenda 2030 is global wakeup call, pushing the world to take action for a better future.
